Legislative Schedule

This week the legislature was in session Tuesday-Thursday for legislative days 23-25. Crossover Day is scheduled for this Thursday, February 29. This was a busy week for both House and Senate committees with lots of bills moving through the legislative process in hopes of making the Crossover Day deadline.

New Senator Enters The Chamber

The newly elected Sen. Tim Bearden was sworn into the Senate this week. Sen. Bearden filled the seat for District 30 after former Sen. Mike Dugan resigned earlier this year to run for a congressional seat. Sen. Bearden is no stranger to the General Assembly, having served in the Georgia House of Representatives from 2005-2011. Georgia Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA)

SB180 by Sen. Ed Setzler (R-Acworth) restricts state and local government from burdening a person's exercise of religion, even if the burden results from a rule of general applicability. The bills proponents claim it mirrors federal RFRA law that does not apply to state or local levels though opponents were quick to repeal that it does not contain an establishment clause. The bill author stated that the rationale for the bill is to balance personal freedom with rational basis for individuals practicing their faith. SB180 passed out of the Senate Judiciary Committee on a 6-3 vote and is eligible for Crossover Day on LD 28. GHLA will continue to oppose any legislation that gives the perception that Georgia is an unwelcoming state.

Human Trafficking Legislation

<u>SB512</u> by Sen. Shawn Still (R-Norcross) combines three bills in a perfected committee substitute. The bill creates a new commission, the Victims of Human Trafficking Fund Commission, to protect all victims of human trafficking, not just children. The funds will only be used on such victims to pay for care, rehabilitation, and social services. The bill also includes language for hotel and motel human trafficking training. SB512 passed

out of the Senate Public Safety committee this week and is eligible to be on the floor for Crossover Day. GHLA has been and will continue to work with Senator Still as this important legislation moves through the legislative process.

<u>SR616</u> by Sen. Shawn Still (R-Norcross) is a constitutional amendment that would appear on the ballot in November that would allow additional penalties for individuals convicted of human trafficking. The penalty would allow for civil forfeitures to fund the Victims of Human Trafficking Fund.

<u>HR1255</u> by Rep. Eric Bell (D-Jonesboro) seeks to create the House Study Committee on Combating Human Trafficking in Major Transportation Areas.

Premise Liability Tort Reform Legislation

Entitled the Georgia Landowners Protection Act, <u>SB186</u> by Sen. Greg Dolezal (R-Cumming) revises Georgia's premise liability laws following on a number of appellate decisions that highlighted inequities and inconsistencies in Georgia law. This bill has seen a lot of movement over the last year, having made it out of committee in 2023 and being recommitted back at the beginning of session this year. SB186 was favorably reported by the Senate Insurance and Labor committee this week. GHLA is supportive of this measure.

<u>HB1371</u> by Rep. James Burchett (R-Waycross) would clarify liability regarding third-party criminal activity. This bill amends Chapter 3 of Title 9 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated on tolling of limitations, changing provisions relating to tolling of limitations for a civil cause of action arising from criminal activity.

Phasing Out Subminimum Wage

<u>HB1125</u> by Rep. Sharon Cooper (R-Marietta) phases out the payment of subminimum wage to persons with disabilities and requires that employers must pay individuals with disabilities at least half of the federally mandated minimum wage. This bill was favorably reported by the House Industry and Labor committee and awaits further decision in the House Rules committee.

- HB1337 Mableton, City of; levy an excise tax
- <u>HB1345</u> Peace Officer Standards and Training Council; minimum number of basic training courses and required content for peace officers; provide
- <u>HB1353</u> Landlord and tenant; repeal prohibition on local governments regulating amount of rent; provisions
- HB1355 Home Based Businesses Entrepreneurship Act; enact
- <u>HB1359</u> Ad valorem tax; refund for loss of property value or expenses due to failure of local governments to enforce certain laws; provisions
- HB1364 Torts; liability of owners and occupiers of land; weapons; provisions
- HB1371 Torts; clarify liability regarding third-party criminal activity; provisions

- SB534 "Fair Business Practices Act of 1975"; failure of a marketplace innkeeper to provide a consumer with an itemized receipt detailing certain taxes and fees is an unlawful business practice; provide
- <u>SB548</u> "Fair Business Practices Act of 1975"; merchants from refusing to accept cash for purchases; prohibit
- <u>SB549</u> "Fair Business Practices Act of 1975"; retailers from conditioning the issuance of refunds on the buyer returning goods to any place; prohibit

- <u>SR616</u> Victims of Human Trafficking Fund; allocation of certain additional penalties and assessments; provide -CA
- <u>SR623</u> Dept of Natural Resources, Dept. of Economic Dev., and Dept. of Community Affairs; cooperate in crafting strategies to promote outdoor recreation; encourage
